THE HISTORY OF THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE



MIDDLE ENGLISH

v1100 – 1800 C.E


- The Normans, who spoke French, invaded England. (French influence)
- Royalties and government officials began speaking French.
- English became language of the poor (peasants, butchers, maids, servants)
- Also the language of poets and writers.
- English kings began marrying Norman women.
- English children became bilingual.



OLD ENGLISH

v400 – 1100 C.E (Common Era)

- Old English was heavily influenced by Germanic tribes and sounds a bit like a mash of German and Icelandic rather than modern English.
- Old English would be completely impossible to understand for a modern Englishman.



MODERN ENGLISH

1500 – today

- Writers like Shakespeare introduced a written standard English.
- There were also invented over 2000 words such as; critical and majestic.
- People started borrowing words from other languages, since trade was more common.
