Modern English (1500 - today) nakespeare introduced a ritten standard English.



Subject + used to + infinitive verb + Complement

- ✓ She used to write a poem.
- ✓ They used to live in Paris

negative

Subject + didn't + use to + verb in Infinitive Form + Complement

- ✓ She didn't use to write a poem.
- ✓ They didn't use to live in Paris.

Interrogative

Did + Subject + use to + verb in Infinitive form + Complement +?

- ✓ Did she use to write a poem?
- ✓ Did they use to live in Paris?
