Present Perfect Tense – Since & For

We use the present perfect tense with **SINCE** (desde) and **FOR** (por) to say how long an action has lasted.

Examples:

I have played the piano **since** 2000.

I have played the piano **for** five years.



Pay attention to this chart!

SINCE (the starting point) THE TIME IS SPECIFIC	FOR (a period of time) THE TIME IS NOT SPECIFIC
6.15 pm / 6 o'clock (TIME)	5, 10, 20, 30 minutes/ 2, 4, 6... hours
Monday, Tuesday, etc (DAYS OF THE WEEK)	2, 3, 10 days/ 2,4,6... weeks
January, February (MONTHS OF THE YEAR)	6, 7, 9, months
1998, 2015 - (YEARS)	4, 25, 30 years
